



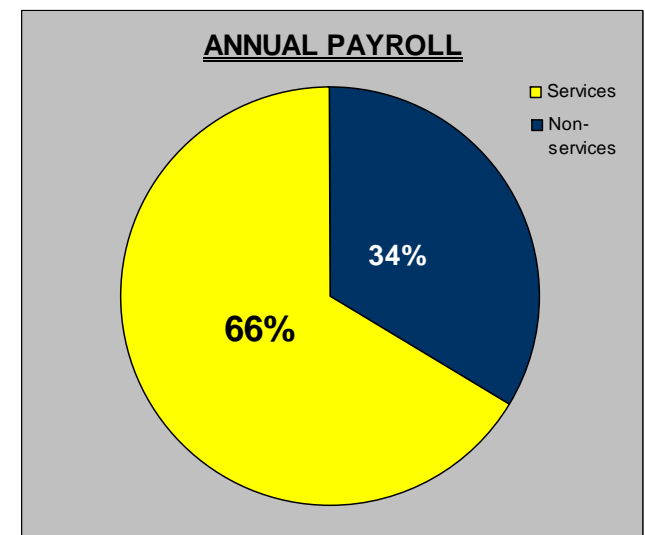
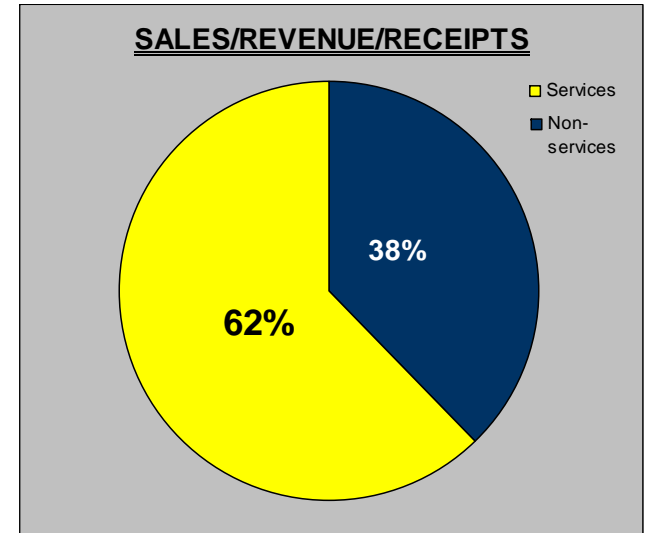

Services and the State of Vermont

The importance of the service sector to the state of Vermont is illustrated vividly by recently-released data from the US Bureau of the Census. Census data show that the services sector employs 75% of the Vermont workforce, in industries such as wholesale and retail trade, transportation & warehousing, finance & insurance, real estate, renting, & leasing, professional services, and many others. Services account for 66% of the state's \$7 billion payroll, and represent 62% of the \$32 billion in sales from the state's business establishments.
